The Heritage Council’s successful Local Government Heritage Planning and Management Seminar will be held on 3-4 May 2012 and will be hosted by the Shire of Bridgetown-Greenbushes.

This year’s themes are Historic Towns, Heritage Tourism and Community Heritage.

Join us for this two-day event, which will include presentations from a wide range of speakers, many from the South West region. Friday’s sessions will run in parallel, with one stream intended for planning officers, elected members or others involved in urban planning. Delegates may attend either session, but may be asked to identify their preference in advance to determine allocation of rooms and seating arrangements.

The Seminar is open to all, but includes material that is of particular relevance to those in local government, both at officer level and elected members. Planning officers will receive professional development (PD) points for the event.

Last year, over 40 representatives attended the seminar from across the State, each enjoying a program of presentations, site visits and networking. The feedback of the Seminar was very positive, and we look forward to presenting a range of engaging topics and activities at the event this May.

The cost, which includes refreshments and lunch on both days and the dinner on Thursday evening is **\$380+GST**.
