The ICOMOS theme for 2012 is World Heritage in celebration of the 40th Anniversary of the World Heritage Convention.

To mark the anniversary, you are invited to participate in Queensland's World Heritage Forum, followed by refreshments in the recently opened UQ Anthropology Museum.

Input from each state into the 3 key questions below will be forwarded to the national symposium to be held in Sydney during November.

The Forum will address the questions via our four speakers, followed by a panel discussion.

1. THE INTERNATIONAL QUESTION:

As it reaches its 40th Anniversary, is the UNESCO Convention Concerning the Protection of the World Cultural and Natural Heritage still a convention for conservation? If it isn't, what is it now a convention for?

2. THE NATIONAL QUESTION:

If we look back on the last 40 years, what has Australia contributed to the international endeavour of World Heritage? What could Australia offer the world in the next 10 years?

3. THE COMMUNITY QUESTION:

Does the World Heritage Convention support communities in their endeavour to protect their heritage? Does the Convention and its operations provide benefits for communities?

Professor Ian Lilley

Professor Ian Lilley is Director of Research within the UQ Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Studies Unit, archaeologist, ICOMOS World Heritage Assessor and Secretary-General of the ICOMOS International Committee on Archaeological Heritage Management.

Dr Jane Lennon

Dr Jane Lennon is a Brisbane-based heritage consultant. She has over 30 years experience in heritage conservation and was a member of the Australian Heritage Commission then Council, ICCROM and the governing council of Old Parliament House, Canberra. She has been a World Heritage nomination assessor, prepared the first draft of World Heritage Working Paper no.26 and just co-authored a book on *Managing Cultural Landscapes* which highlights the role of the World Heritage cultural landscape designations from 1992.

Kristal Buckley

Kristal Buckley is a Lecturer in Cultural Heritage at Deakin University's Cultural Heritage Centre for Asia and the Pacific in Melbourne, Australia. She has professional qualifications in archaeology, anthropology and public policy, and has worked in private practice, government, teaching and research. Kristal has served as an International Vice-President of ICOMOS since 2005, is a past President of Australia ICOMOS and is a member of the ICOMOS ISC for Intangible Cultural Heritage. She has been a member of the ICOMOS delegation to the World Heritage Committee since 2007.

Dr Jane Harrington

Jane Harrington has specific interests in community and intangible heritage, social value, cultural landscapes, world heritage, and the natural world. Jane is the Director of Conservation and Infrastructure with the Port Arthur Historic Site Management Authority in Tasmania. She has been on the AI Executive since 2006, is the World Heritage Reference Group Co-ordinator, and is the current President.
